

PRODUCT CARE

Merino wool

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These days, one can't imagine the closet of most outdoor enthusiasts without merino in it. For longer, more intense and sweaty outings, merino neutralizes odors, dries very quickly, and is self-cleaning. In the DYNAFIT collection, merino fibers are combined with synthetic fibers for even more durable, functional apparel items. With the addition of polyester, elastane or polyamide fibers, the fabric has more stretch and is more resistant to tears. In addition, a blend of merino and synthetic fibers dries even more quickly and wicks away moisture.

NICE TO KNOW

- Merino wool must not be washed after every wear. Simply hang to air out the clothing. Since wool is self-cleaning, odors disappear very quickly.
- Should your apparel pieces made of merino need to be washed, then care is demanded. That's because wool is sensitive when wet to mechanical stress.
- ► Wash with low temperatures that protects your clothing and the environment.

WASH/DRY

Prior to washing

- ► Check washing instructions on the tag.
- ► Close and secure all zippers and empty pockets.
- ► Turn the piece inside out. That protects the outer material of your product.
- ► Pre-treat heavy dirt or stains by soaking it for some time in lukewarm water with some thinned gentle liquid detergent.

Washing

- Avoid all bleach products
- © Choose the wool wash cycle (cold or 30 °C)
- ► Fill the machine to no more than half and, if possible, use a wool laundry bag.
- ► For washing your merino garments, we recommend selecting a wool wash cycle with a cool/cold water temperature (30 °C). Take note: Washing at temperatures that are too hot for any kind of wool can lead to apparel shrinking or become misshapen.
- ► A special detergent for wool without enzymes is especially gentle for your apparel. Traditional detergent often has enzymes that can attack the protein fibers of wool.
- Avoid using fabric softener.
- ► Large and heavy pieces of apparel made of merino should be spun dry just briefly at a low spin (400-600 maximum); smaller and lighter pieces are less sensitive and can handle medium spin cycles (up to about 1,000).



Drying

- □ Do not iron
- ► If your apparel comes out of the machine dripping wet, you can wrap it in a towel and carefully press out excess moisture.
- ► Merino apparel is best dried flat on a laundry rack with a towel underneath it. Especially lightweight pieces can also be hung to dry.
- ► Turn your merino apparel occasionally to speed up the drying process.
- ► Heat can lead to the wool fibers feeling scratchy. Thus, please avoid putting your apparel on a heater or in direct sunshine.

CARE

Directly after activity

Air out your clothing overnight in fresh air after wear.



STORAGE

In-season

During the season when you are using the garment, store your merino apparel best folded in a dry area, away from direct sunshine.

Off-Season

- During the off-season, we recommend you store the apparel in a sealed clothing storage bag.
- ► Moths love wool materials, which is why care is needed here. Cedar, neem, and pine, when placed in a closet or bag, can offer natural protection against moths.
